Recollections

Recollections are excerpts of stories submitted to the College for the 75th Anniversary book written by Con Marshall. If you are interested in reading the full story please contact the Alumni office. The following is an excerpt entitled "Speaker Crosses Up President" by Larry Tangeman.

"For several years prior to World War II, the enrollment at Chadron State College was in the neighborhood of 250 to 300 students. The great need

for teachers following the war and continuing into the 1950s set the stage for calling on state colleges and universities across the land to prepare them in increasing numbers.

In 1955 or '56, President Barton Kline...called a meeting of teachers and administrators from the Panhandle...The featured speaker was Dr. Earl Wiltse, superintendent of schools in Grand Island. When it came time for him to speak he couldn't be found. Kline knew Wiltse was on campus, so the present went ahead with his welcome with the hopes that the speaker would show.

As it turned out, Wiltse was tired from his trip, had taken a nap in the lobby of a dormitory and had overslept."

In Their Words

Scholarships make education attainable and allow recipients to focus on their studies at Chadron State College. In Their Words demonstrates the impact scholarships make in students' lives.

The Clifford W. "Pete" & Bernadette Carroll Endowed Scholarship was established in 2001. Pete came to Chadron from Cambridge and played four years of football and was the captain of the 1933 team that won the Nebraska State College Championship. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 1988. He served in World War II before a career with the Veterans Administration and Bureau of Indian Affairs. The scholarship is awarded to a member of the football team. Michael DeCamillis of Westminster, Colorado was a recent recipient of the scholarship.

"I am very thankful to be named a recipient of this scholarship. This scholarship enables me to further chase my dreams of becoming an educator. Knowing that Mr. Carroll excelled on the football field and achieved many great things gives me motivation and a standard to strive for."
