ESSENTIAL STUDIES STRUCTURAL CRITERIA:

All first year students are required to take 6 credits of an FYI. Students will practice skills involved in Critical Inquiry and Creative Problem Solving through interdisciplinary, collaborative engagement of a specific issue or theme. This experience may be a single 6-hour course or two 3-hour courses. The Essential Studies requirements consist of 39 credits within twelve categories.

TRANSFER CREDITS:

Some courses transfer in automatically and some course must be proven through the substitution process. A course substitution is a good idea when: 1) you have taken a course from another institution which covers the same content as a CSC course; 2) your faculty advisor recommends a course substitution; 3) a required course is no longer offered. To transfer credits through course substitution contact your academic advisor.
