Essential Studies Program Committee Approval for CAPSTONE TOPICS Courses

From the 2015-17 CSC Catalog:

CAPSTONE INTEGRATION (3 CREDIT HOURS)

Students will integrate essential studies skills, knowledge and abilities, adapting them to new settings, questions, and responsibilities.

Student Learning Outcome (SLO) 12. Students will complete a culminating experience that illustrates effective application of their essential studies skills, modes of inquiry and personal and social responsibility through one of the following projects:

An Essential Studies Capstone Course (CAP 469 prefix) where students produce a creative or scholarly
work requiring broad knowledge, appropriate technical proficiency, information collection, interpretation,
synthesis, presentation, and reflection that grows out of interdisciplinary, collaborative engagement of a
specific issue or theme. Approved courses appear on the Essential Studies Program website.

(NOTE: catalogs before 2015 require SIX hours of CAP 469 Credit)

A capstone, independent study or other advanced-project course within a specific department or program
that meets SLO #12 criteria and has been approved by the essential studies program committee. Successful
completion of the project will include a presentation illustrating the application of Capstone Integration
outcomes as outlined on the Essential Studies Program website.

In its review of requests for approval of CAP TOPICS courses to fulfill SLO#12, the Essential Studies Program Committee will use such criteria as:

- Does the course clearly address the Learning Outcome(s) identified?
- Does the course provide students with opportunities to develop the knowledge/skills necessary for successful achievement of the Learning Outcome(s)?
- Does the course provide students with opportunities to demonstrate achievement of the Learning Outcome(s)?
- Have the hosting department/unit and the instructor(s) agreed to follow through with their responsibilities as outlined in the approval form?
