Math Science Center of Innovative Learning

Chadron State College and the Foundation are committed to ensuring the Math Science project can meet the requirements for STEM education at CSC. This \$32.1 million renovation and new construction will drastically change the landscape of not only the Chadron State campus, but for generations of future Eagles. The fifty-year-old facility has also been renamed the Math Science Center of Innovative Learning as part of its transformation. A major component of funding comes from the state of Nebraska however private support is required to make this project a reality. CSC Women's Wrestling... The Nebraska State College System Board of Trustees approved the proposal to add women's wrestling as a new sport. Forty-four NCAA-sponsored schools have expanded to include women's wrestling and Chadron State is the first public college/university to do so in Nebraska.

Say That Again



Say That Again, Stories Told By Speakers at Chadron State College is a recent publication by CSC news reporter Con Marshall. Donald Huls moved to Chadron in 1957 from Ottawa, Kansas, and took over operation of the Chadron Record. Donald recounted early Chadron history in March of 1985 at the weekly Phi Alpha Theta Meeting.

In 1878, four ranches were established in northwest Nebraska. They were the Agate Springs Ranch in Sioux County, the Three Crow Ranch south of Crawford, the Hunter Ranch near what is now Rushville and the Newman Ranch in eastern Sheridan County. Huls said Edgar Bronson, the founder of the Three Crow Ranch, reported in 1877 he rode horseback for 60 days through the region and didn't see a single person. A number of the early residents of northwest Nebraska didn't stay in the area too long. Some of them had bad experiences with farming and ranching or were businessman of sorts who "skimmed off the cream" and headed to another new town.

In Their Words

Scholarships make education attainable and allow recipients to focus on their studies at Chadron State College. In Their Words demonstrates the impact scholarships make in students' lives.

Lloyd and Winona Brecht helped students attend Chadron State College for over 35 years. The Brechts farmed in the Deadhorse community southwest of Chadron since 1939 and told Con Marshall in 1995 they haven't done that much. "Mostly we've just been around and given a little moral support," said Lloyd. The Lloyd and Winona Brecht Endowed Scholarship has provided multiple scholarships each year since it was established through their estate. Vonsinh Sayaloune was a 2020-21 recipient of the award.
