

A Bit of History: 1921, A Century Ago... The school's first gymnasium, now known as the Miller Building, was completed at a cost of about \$90,000. State Sen. Jimmy Good of Chadron, introduced a bill in the Legislature changing the status of the four state normal schools to teachers colleges.

Eaglaires Sang in Caribbean by Rose Burrows. "The way we were during the early '60s at Chadron, hangs as a misty but very real entity in my mind. I can nearly touch my memories, so strong were these times impressed upon my character. The most dramatic recollection I



have was of the Eaglaires' USO show trip to the Caribbean. Competition for participation was strong in meeting Dr. Alfred Blinde's high standard in his search for the perfect sound. I gasped when I heard that I was chosen. The month-long trip during December was paid for by the U.S. Defense Department. We sometimes would sing three times a day."
