A New Phonathon... The annual phonathon, held in February, has concluded as a success. Alumni from across the country contributed over \$135,000 in gifts and pledges over 13 calling days. 2021 also was a milestone as the Foundation implemented a computer based calling system for the CSC student callers. While planning for phonathon in the Covid-19 Era, the Foundation understood that the traditional paper and dial operations would not be compliant with directed health measures. Students enjoyed the use of the computer

system and hopefully our alumni didn't notice much of a change. Thank you to all who contributed, whether financially or simply engaging with a current student.

CSC Value... Recent data from the Nebraska State College System to support funding from the 2021 Nebraska State Legislature showed that a degree from Chadron State College will have an average overall cost that is \$19,977 less than peers. Chadron State remains a great value proposition in higher education, even as tuition costs continue to rise.

Congratulations... Chadron State College's Director of College Relations Alex Helmbrecht '05, received the national Blue Key Outstanding Advisor Award for 2021. "He seeks out opportunities to serve students and the campus in ways that make students a top priority. All of these activities reflect his innate leadership abilities and eagerness to assume leadership responsibilities; his role as Blue Key Honor Society advisor is one such example," Dr. Tracy Nobiling, Professor of Justice Studies wrote.

Student Travel Returns... Not yet, but faculty and students are hard at work planning and preparing for a 2021/22 academic year that allows for student travel to resume. The London and Dublin program is specifically tailored for students in Art, Business, Education, Justice Studies, Counseling, and Psychology. "Life on Two Wheels: A Travelogue of American History and Culture" will be new in 2021 with CSC courses preparing students for a summer 2021 coast-to-coast ride. Scholarships make education attainable and allow recipients to focus on their studies at Chadron State College. In Their Words demonstrates the impact scholarships make in students' lives.



Former Secretary of the Interior Stewart Udall told an audience at Chadron State College that he wishes he were young again because he feels the United States is on the threshold of great opportunity, although it must revise its national priorities while speaking in 1991.

"The next 10 years should be the most interesting and hopeful period in my lifetime," said Udall, who was the first cabinet member selected by President John F. Kennedy following the 1960 elections. With the Cold War ending Udall added that the nation has placed too much focus on self and needs to stress the building of health communities. "Wouldn't it be great if our number one questions about a community again would be, "is it a good place for children to grow up?" he said.



Eagles Rise

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Chadron State College students are dealing with unprecedented changes in higher education while maintaining their educational goals. Chadron State is sensitive to how this situation is affecting you and your family, and we are humbled by the generosity of those who have stepped forward to ask: "How can we help?" For those who are able and interested in providing support to our students, CSC and the

Foundation have identified avenues to make an impact.

Thanks to the leadership of the Chadron State Foundation Board of Directors, up to \$50,000 has been committed to create a matching fund: the Eagles Rise Student Relief Fund. Over \$11,000 has already been distributed to students facing hardships over the past couple months. The fund has helped students who may not have been eligible for the \$540,000 in federal CARES Act funds.
