





The fifty-year-old facility has also been renamed the Math Science Center of Innovative Learning as part of its transformation. 



CSC Student Studied World by Gretchen Glode
Berggren, M.D. "A special benefit of living in
Chadron was the possibility of going to the college's
summer sessions even as a high school student.
Thus, I took German one summer and translated
Albert Scheitzer's Leben und Deken. I had already
been thinking of a career as a medical missionary.
In the passages where Schweitzer described his
reaction to the piece of sculpture in Paris depicting
a black slave in chains, I was moved to tears. And, I
took his challenge that all of us must consider
giving our lives in service to Africa so that in some
small way we could uplift rather than enslave the
people. Here on a small campus in the northwest
corner of Nebraska, we studied the world."
