Thank you for creating opportunities and supporting the life of Chadron State College.

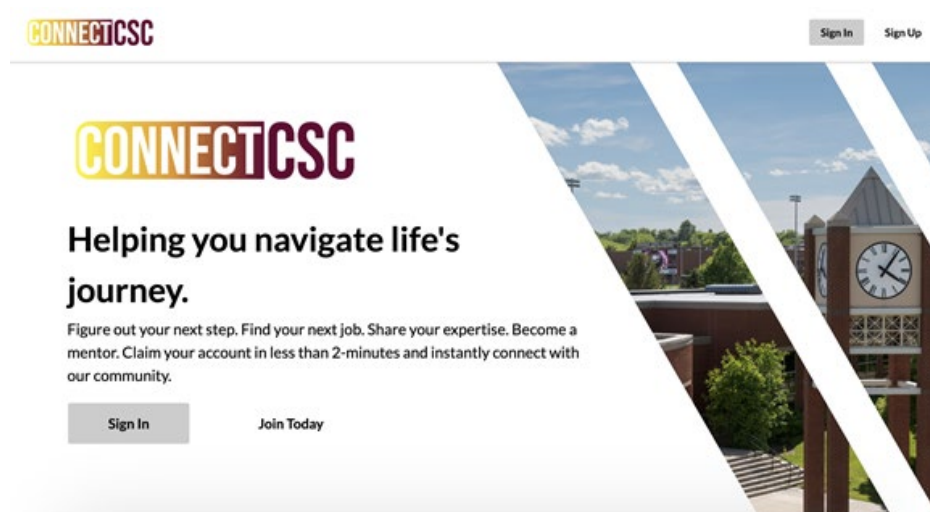


Math Science Center of Innovative Learning

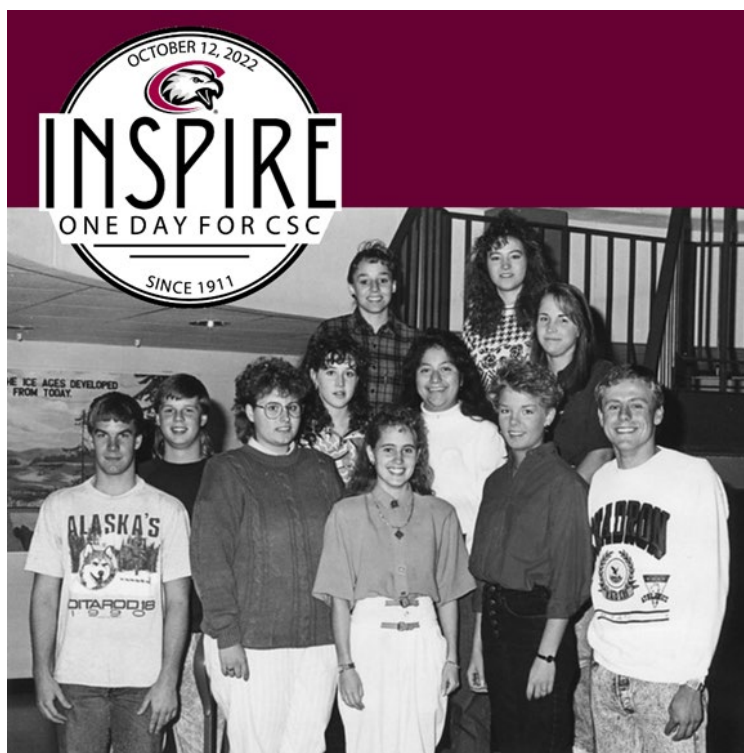
