The Foundation Board of Directors recently approved record scholarship support levels for the 2022-23 academic year.

Endowed scholarships will distribute \$731,591 and a \$100,000 Grant to Campus will provide campus leadership funds to recruit and retain students. In March 2020 I certainly would not have thought this was the trajectory we were on, but thanks to generous donors and thoughtful governance by the Board of Directors we hope to continue to support students and campus.

Chadron State College and the Foundation are committed to ensuring the Math Science project can meet the requirements for STEM education at CSC. This \$32.1 million renovation and new construction will drastically change the landscape of not only the Chadron State campus, but for generations of future Eagles. The fifty-year-old facility has also been renamed the Math Science Center of Innovative Learning as part of its transformation. Yakov Smirnoff is a Ukrainian-American comedian, actor, and writer. He began his career as a stand-up comedian in Ukraine, then immigrated to the United States in 1977. The comedian gave two performances in November 1993 at Memorial Hall.

"What a country!" Those were the magic words comedian Yakov Smirnoff used to help captivate his audiences in Memorial Hall. Smirnoff expressed his love for his adopted nation both by poking fun at it and by telling some of the advantages it holds over the former Soviet Union. Smirnoff said he didn't have much of a chance to practice comedy in Russia, his script there had to be reviewed by the Department of Jokes, and it could include nothing about politics, government, sex or religion. One of the nice things about America, he said, is "the warning shot." There is no such thing in Russia, he related. Instead, they shoot someone to warn the next guy.

Three generations of the Brennan family have enjoyed accomplishments associated with Chadron State College.
