Important Notes:

The total minimum number of hours required for graduation with a Bachelor of Arts degree is 120 hours, with a minimum of 40 hours upper division credit (300- or 400- level classes).

Also, students must complete 39 hours of the Essential Studies (ES) program in addition to the Criminal Justice major requirements.

Some courses are offered every other year. Consult your advisor for course rotation information.

Electives in Criminal Justice consist of class offerings from five focus areas: Law Enforcement (CJ 233, 321, 435, 437, 469); Law (CJ 331, 333, 334, 433, 438);

Corrections (CJ 249, 338, 430, 431, 443); Forensic Studies (CJ 235, 323, 444, 449, 450); Juvenile Justice (CJ 322, 332, 432, 440; LS 236).

A student who elects an emphasis in Criminal Justice must complete four (4) courses in a focus area.

A student pursuing a minor must complete CJ 231, 232, 236, 337, as well as one course (3 hrs) from three of the five focus areas (total 21 hours).

A transfer student's schedule may vary significantly. Consult your advisor for more information.

A Criminal Justice internship may be taken any time during the junior or senior year subject to approval by the advisor and Internship Coordinator, availability of work positions, and qualifications of the applicant.
