Vice President Sayaloune. v. Trajan Garcia, Brooks Hall Senator

Opinion of the Court:

- Per Curiam

On October 26, 2017, Vice President Johnathan Sayaloune, filed a petition for review stating that Brooks Hall Senator Trajan Garcia had missed the Senate meetings on October 9 and October 23, 2017. Senator Garcia then did not respond to the petition within the designated two academic days and the Court issued a summary judgment in favor of the petitioner ordering Senator Garcia to comply with the Senate bylaw regarding “ATTENDANCE” for the remainder of his term. Senator Garcia was then served the order on October 30 before the Senate meeting. Senator Garcia then did not attend nor give notice of his absence on October 30, 2017.

Vice President Sayaloune then filed a petition alleging that Senator Garcia violated the order of the Court. Senator Garcia was served the petition and did not file a response within the designated two academic days. This Court therefore issues a summary judgement in favor of the petitioner, finding that there was a violation of the Senate bylaw regarding “ATTENDANCE” and recommends the Senate impeach Senator Garcia and therefore bind this case over to the Senate of the Chadron State College Student Association for a removal vote.
