Merry Christmas everybody! November 8th was selected as the date for the annual National First-Generation College Celebration to honor the anniversary of the signing of the Higher Education Act (HEA) of 1965. HEA emerged out of President Lyndon B. Johnson's War on Poverty. Much like other hall-mark legislation of that era, HEA was intended to help level a playing field that for too long had been weighed against Americans from minority and low-income backgrounds. In addition to creating federal grants and loan programs to



help students finance their educations, the legislation made key investments in institutions of higher education. Additionally, HEA ushered in programs, particularly the Federal TRIO programs (UPWARD BOUND!!), necessary for postsecondary access, retention, and completion for low-income, potential first-generation college graduates.

On Monday, November 8th, 2021, Upward Bound partnered with CSC Project Strive to host a First Generation Celebration Dinner. This special evening was dedicated to celebrating the success of first-generation students in both the Upward Bound and Project Strive programs. Guest speakers included Dr. Alaric Williams, Dean of Professional Studies & Applied Sciences at CSC, who spoke on how "It's Not How You Start", it's how you finish. Dr. Williams was a first-generation college student himself. Following Dr. Williams, was Project Strive student Bobby Peele. Bobby spoke to the attendees about "Second Chances and What You Make of Them" with an inspirational story about his time in the California Penitentiary and he used that experience to change his life for the better.
