September SMART Goal Setting- What are SMART goals?

SMART goals are established using a specific set of criteria that ensures your goals are attainable. SMART is an acronym that stands for Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Time-Bound. When writing a SMART goal, you work through each of those terms to build a goal that shares exactly what needs to be accomplished, when it needs to be accomplished by, and how you'll know when you're successful. Setting goals this way is helpful, because it eliminates generalities and guesswork, sets a clear finish line, and makes it that much easier to track progress and identify missed targets.
